Spring sports are ending, and we are close to naming new state champions in track, baseball, softball, tennis, and golf. Congratulations to all our spring sport coaches. I trust that in between the school year ending, summer strength and conditioning, and the coming new school year, you can get some very deserved vacation time with family and loved ones. I also remember the excitement as teachers/coaches as we watch our graduating seniors walk across the stage of graduation, praying that things go well for them as they meet the challenges in their new adventures.

This school year, the OACA has been celebrating its 89th year of serving high school coaches in our state. It has been a busy and productive year as this year has passed rapidly. We need to thank this year's OACA Executive Board for their outstanding leadership and guidance. Special words of appreciation to Ronda McKenzie, Westview HS, this year's Board President for her excellent leadership this year. Our leadership team is excited to have Greg Grant, Heppner HS as our 2024-25 OACA Board President. This has been a very productive year for our Association. Our membership numbers continued to grow to close to where we were pre-covid. In December we provided a check for over \$59,000 to the OSAA in Gold Card partnership with the OSAA, bringing the 24-year total to over one million dollars. We sponsored six sport-specific clinics, which over 2000 coaches participated in. The Board of Directors sponsored five different OSAA policy changes in cross country, volleyball, soccer, basketball, softball. Last month, we honored over 330 coaches and family members at the 38th Annual OACA Awards Banquet. In 1986 the first OACA "Coach of the Year" Banquet was held with 50-60 coaches in attendance. 1986 also marked the year where the OACA began recognizing and honoring graduating senior student-athletes. This year, we had over 100 quality applications for our scholarships, with our selection committee choosing fourteen student scholarships, totaling \$25,000 that will be awarded this coming fall. For a complete list of all the scholarship award winners see page 8 of the newsletter. With the fourteen scholarship award winners this year, a total of \$338,000 has been awarded to OACA families over the 38 years of the scholarship program. We greatly appreciate our Sponsors, Pacific Office Automation, Buffalo Wild Wings, BSN Sports, Oregon Army National Guard, Leading Edge Fundraising, Hudl, MaxPreps, Prime Time Sports, Sheraton Portland Airport Hotel, Teams of Men, Oregon State Credit Union, and Dave Dowling who provide funds that go directly to our scholar athletes.

The new membership year for our Association begins July 1. Make sure to renew your membership to take advantage of the many benefits included. We would like to announce a change in the prices for membership for the 2024-25 school year. With increased costs due to inflation and credit card processing costs, the cost of an OACA Gold Card Membership when purchased by credit card/PayPal will be \$72, a \$4 increase. If you pay by check/cash/purchase order, the cost is \$69. The cost of a retired Gold Card is \$60, and a Regular Membership is \$55.

"Kids Need Coaches Today More Than Ever!" As a coach, we have tremendous influence and impact on our student-athletes. Coaching and teaching today's high school student-athletes is a demanding profession, and the better your mental and physical condition, the better able you will be to help your athletes. A healthy mental and physical lifestyle leads to a better and productive coach. I would challenge each of you this summer to take the time to relax, spend time with family and reenergize yourself. Their charge will be to look at the qualifying percentages across all team sports, individual sports, and activities to find best practices in each to allow the State Championship Committee the ability to easily review proposals that may come forward through the process. Now, more than ever, it's important to retain positive people in the professions of coaches, officials, and athletic directors. It's imperative that we continue to support one another so we can continue to grow, develop, and maintain the leaders of tomorrow. ## OACA MEMBERSHIP 2024-2025

There are many benefits to being an OACA member: A \$2,000,000 liability insurance benefit that covers you for all coaching and teaching activities in/out of season, camp insurance eligibility, reduced-fee sports clinics, OACA e-newsletters, representation for each sport/class to the OSAA for the purpose of improving high school athletics, recognition at our annual awards banquet, state and national awards, eight \$1,000 student scholarships for high school graduating sons and daughters of our members, and a \$50,000 sexual abuse coverage for litigation cost to member who was unjustly accused.

You will receive your Gold Cards electronically through an email from the OSAA Website, Subject line: "2024-25 OSAA Gold Card." The email contains a link for your card and instructions on how to save the link to your mobile device. **We recognize that some members do not have a smart phone. Membership hard copies are available for those individuals. Both the Digital and Hard Copies are valid for admission into HS/OSAA events.** If your phone is unable to process a digital card, contact our office at 541-928-2700 or melissa@oregoncoach.org.

#### **OACA Liability Insurance Info:**

The liability coverage policy period is August 1 – July 31 and is activated as soon as you receive your membership card. It covers the coach during their season, off-season workouts, and during summer activities. College and Youth Coaches are not covered by the Liability Insurance policy; the policy only covers High School and Middle School Coaches. As a 2023-24 OACA Member you are covered during this summer's activities. After July 31, our new membership year will begin and you will need to sign up again to be covered Aug. 1st, 2024-July 31st, 2025.

It is in your best interest to sign up for your membership at the beginning of each membership year and take advantage of the entire membership year. It does not matter if you coach a winter or spring sport, you can sign up for your membership as soon as the new school year opens and have the benefit of your insurance for the entire membership year that also covers you when you are in the class-room. Online Membership Registration for the 2024-25 school year will begin on July 1st at <a href="https://www.oregoncoach.org">www.oregoncoach.org</a>.

Please note: While Membership Registration begins on July 1st, digital and hard copies of cards will not be sent out until early August.
